Environmental and Engineering Department at UGM is one of Indonesia's oldest and most prestigious engineering schools, with a legacy that dates back to the revolutionary era of the nation's independence. Evolving from the Technische Hoogeschool during Dutch colonial rule in 1920 to 1945, CEED has played a crucial role in shaping the country's engineering education, transitioning through historic milestones, and becoming part of Universitas Gadjah Mada (UGM), which is ranked 239th in the QS World University Rankings, solidifying its position as one of the top institutions in the region.

Study program accreditation


We have a total student body of 1,278, with approximately 50% enrolled in the Civil Engineering Undergraduate Program. The program is accredited internationally by the Indonesia Accreditation Board for Engineering Education (IABEE). IABEE has been a full signatory for Indonesia under the Washington Accord (2022) and the Seoul Accord (2024). Nationally, the program is accredited by the Board of National Accreditation for Higher Education (BAN-PT).



Lecturer and field of expertise

Supported by 24 professors, 33 doctorate holders, 10 master-level lecturers, and 49 administrative staff, CEED offers robust academic support. Program overview: IE Outbound Program

The IE Outbound Program offers students the chance to spend one or two semesters at partner universities abroad. Participants can take regular semester courses with the opportunity to transfer credits.

There are several types of IE Outbound Program as follows:

1. Double-degree Program

This scheme allows students to obtain two undergraduate degrees—one from UGM and one from a partner university. The student must do at least one final defense, either in UGM or partner university. It requires credit transfer for all courses, with conditions on course equivalency (matching credit load and program objectives). Students will complete 3 years in Indonesia and 1 year abroad (2 semesters).

2. Student Exchange Program

This program allows credit transfer with conditions on course credit and program educational objectives. It offers two study options: 3 years in Indonesia and 1 year abroad, or 3.5 years in Indonesia and 0.5 years abroad, but it does not result in obtaining second degree.

3. Short Program

The short course lasts 2-4 weeks. Student exposes to international atmosphere through projects with a partner institution, as well as site visits and excursions. Short course does not result in obtaining second degree. However, the student will get a certificate of completion.

4. Internship

The student is allowed to undertake this scheme as long as he/she has been accepted to take internship in an international company which is located abroad. The duration of the internship can be up to 6 months.

Dual-degree Program

Overview

The dual degree program allows CEED FoE UGM students to earn an S.T. (Sarjana Teknik) degree from UGM and either an Ing. (Ingenieur) or B.Eng. (Bachelor of Engineering) degree from the host university, depending on the program. The program typically takes one year to complete

Students are required to complete a minimum of 128 credits, which typically includes six semesters at UGM. Please note that Community Service (Kuliah Kerja Nyata) is mandatory to obtain a bachelor's degree from UGM as it enables students to contribute to community by sharing knowledge and experience gained at the university.

During the first semester at the host university, students are required to complete courses by aligning elective courses, capstone design courses, and internship courses with equivalent courses offered by the host university. This alignment ensures the eligibility of credit transfers. Additionally, students must write a bachelor's thesis and pass a comprehensive examination to meet the requirements for their S.T. degree from UGM. The comprehensive examination can be conducted at the host university and credited directly to UGM without the need for additional examinations at UGM.

Eligibility

To participate in the dual degree program, students must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Enrolled as an active undergraduate student of CEED FoE UGM
- 2. Have completed at least five or six semesters in CEED FoE UGM
- 3. Have a cumulative GPA of minimum 3.0 (out of 4.0)
- 4. Have completed at least 104 credits (equivalent to five semesters) at CEED FoE UGM during the application process and a minimum of 128 credits before departure.
- 5. For Dual-Degree Program, the students are required to complete a Community Service (Kuliah Kerja Nyata) before departure.

- 6. Have good English proficiency TOEFL iBT 78, IELTS 6.0. Students must also check and adjust to the specific TOEFL or IELTS score requirements set by the host university, as these may vary.
- 7. Nominated by the home university

Notes

In the event that a student fails to complete the dual degree program at a host university due to unforeseen circumstances, they must return to CEED FoE UGM to complete the remaining courses. In such cases, students will only earn a Sarjana Teknik (S.T.) degree from CEED FoE UGM. Courses taken at the partner university will be transferred to UGM, provided they meet the minimum grade requirement equivalent to C.

Exchange Program

Overview

The exchange program offers CEED FoE UGM students the opportunity to study abroad for one semester at a partner university, gaining valuable international experience. This program enables students to transfer credits from the host university to CEED FoE UGM, ensuring academic progress remains aligned across institutions.

The exchange program can be conducted during the odd semester (Semester 5) or the even semester (Semester 6). While at the host university, students will enroll in core or elective courses or participate in internships, depending on what is offered by the host institution. Upon returning to CEED FoE UGM, students will complete the credit transfer process and continue their studies in the subsequent semester at UGM.

Scheme 1: Host University in Semester 5

Under this scheme, students will complete their first four semesters of study at CEED FoE UGM, focusing on core courses to build foundational knowledge. During Semester 5, students will study at the host university, taking core or elective courses or participating in internships, depending on the host university's offerings. Upon returning to UGM for Semester 6, students will continue their academic journey by completing core courses and fulfilling their degree requirements. This scheme provides early exposure to international academic and cultural environments while maintaining academic continuity.

Scheme 2: Host University in Semester 6

In this scheme, students will complete five semesters of study at CEED FoE UGM, covering both core and elective courses, before spending Semester 6 at the host university. While abroad, students will focus on core or elective courses and internships offered by the host university. Upon returning to UGM, students will undertake Community Service (Kuliah Kerja Nyata) during the interim semester and proceed with elective courses, capstone design courses, and internships in Semester 7. This scheme allows students to integrate their international experience with their ongoing studies at UGM.

Scheme 3: Host University in Semester 7 & 8

This scheme allows students to spend the first six semesters at CEED FoE UGM, completing core courses and/or internships. In Semesters 7 and 8, students study at the host university, focusing on elective courses, capstone design courses, and/or internships, while also finalizing their undergraduate thesis. The undergraduate thesis defense can be conducted at Semester 8, either online while still at the host university or upon returning to Indonesia. This scheme offers an immersive international experience during the final stages of the undergraduate program.

Eligibility

To participate in the dual degree program, students must meet the following requirements:

- 1. Enrolled as an active undergraduate student of CEED FoE UGM
- 2. Have completed at least three or five semesters in CEED FoE UGM
- 3. Have a cumulative GPA of minimum 3.0 (out of 4.0)
- 4. Credit completion requirements:
 - For exchange programs during the odd semester (Semester 5), students must have completed at least 64 credits (equivalent to three semesters) at CEED FoE UGM during the application process and a minimum of 84 credits before departure.
 - For exchange programs during the even semester (Semester 6): students must have completed at least 84 credits (equivalent to five semesters) at CEED FoE UGM during the application process and a minimum of 104 credits before departure.
- 5. Have good English proficiency TOEFL iBT 78, IELTS 6.0
- 6. Nominated by the home university

Application Process & Documents

Required documents

Students must prepare and submit the following documents as part of the application process:

- 1. Curriculum Vitae*)
- 2. Application form as follows $^{*)}$
 - IEP-01 Application Form: This form is used by students to officially apply for the International Exposure Program, specifying their selected program and preferred host universities.
 - IEP-02 Commitment Letter: This form serves as a declaration of the student's commitment to adhere to all regulations and complete the International Exposure Program responsibly.
 - IEP-03 Application for Credit Transfer: This form facilitates the credit transfer process by detailing the equivalency of courses between CEED FoE UGM and the host university.
- 3. English proficiency certificate (IELTS/TOEFL-iBT)
- 4. Academic transcript in English.
- 5. Copy of Indonesian Identity Card (KTP).
- 6. Copy of passport**)

Application process

The double-degree admission process should be completed before the host university's enrollment period is ended, or the students will join a dual degree program in the corresponding admission term of the partner university

Host university

CEED has established partnerships with 24 universities across 13 countries and is continuously working to expand its global network. These collaborations provide valuable opportunities for students to engage in international exposure programs, fostering academic and cultural exchange while strengthening the department's commitment to producing globally competent engineers.



Which host university is right for me?

Choosing a host university is a personal decision that depends on what you wish to gain from the experience. To help you make an informed choice, here are some steps and factors to consider:

1. Conduct thorough research

- Begin by exploring our current outbound opportunities and the websites of potential host universities.
- Review feedback from previous students to gain insights into their experiences at these universities.

2. Key factors to consider

Keep in mind that each host university has its own specific requirements. Pay close attention to the following factors:

- Minimum CGPA requirement
- Restrictions on year of study
- Courses offered and the possibility to transfer credits
- English language requirements
- Medium of instruction at the host institution
- Academic calendar

3. Helpful resources

- Visit the host university's website for detailed information about their programs, courses, and student life.
- Use this information to align your preferences and goals with the opportunities offered by your chosen host university and country.

Post-program

Transfer credit policies

Objectives

The credit transfer process ensures that the credit and grade values of courses completed by students during the International Exposure Program (IEP) are equivalent to those at CEED FoE UGM. This process involves an evaluation based on credit and grade conversion standards, along with course syllabi, to facilitate the formal recognition and documentation of students' academic accomplishments in their official academic transcripts

General Policies

- 1. Grades obtained in courses taken at the host university will be converted and recognized in the CEED FoE UGM transcript as they are, based on credit adjustment.
- 2. Courses taken at the host university through the dual degree or student exchange programs prioritize fulfilling mandatory courses required for graduation from CEED FoE UGM.
- 3. Courses equivalent to those already taken at CEED FoE UGM cannot be retaken at the partner university.

Specific Policies for Double-Degree Program:

1. Students must meet the minimum credit requirements to graduate from CEED FoE UGM.

2. Converted credits exceeding the minimum graduation requirement may still be recognized and recorded in the transcript based on the student's request and approval from the Program Director. These credits will also contribute to the calculation of the Cumulative GPA.

Credit Conversion Guidelines

The credit conversion process follows the UMAP Credit Transfer System (UCTS), utilized by member countries of UMAP (University Mobility in Asia and the Pacific), of which Universitas Gadjah Mada is a participating member. Based on a student workload equivalent to 45 hours, this system standardizes various regional and national credit systems into the UGM Credit System (SKS). The guidelines also draw from official frameworks such as the European Commission's European Education Area, the Quality Assurance Agency for

Higher Education (QAA) in the United Kingdom, the Australian Government Department of Education and Training, and the policies of CEED FoE UGM's partner universities.


